**Description Of Filing**

On March 30, 2001, PJM Interconnection, L.L.C. (“PJM”) submitted for filing revised sheets to the PJM Open Access Transmission Tariff (“PJM Tariff”) and the Amended and Restated Operating Agreement of PJM Interconnection, L.L.C. (“PJM Operating Agreement”) to implement its load response pilot program beginning on June 1, 2001. In an order dated May 30, 2001, the Commission accepted the revised PJM Tariff and PJM Operating Agreement sheets, with modifications, effective June 1, 2001 through May 31, 2002. PJM Interconnection, L.L.C., 95 FERC ¶ 61,306 (2001) (“May 30 Order”). The Commission ordered PJM to make a compliance filing within 15 days.

In compliance with the May 30 Order, PJM modifies the revised PJM Tariff and PJM Operating Agreement sheets that it filed on March 30, 2001, as follows:

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- Original Sheet Nos. 256E and 256K of the PJM Tariff and Original Sheet Nos. 119E and 119K of the PJM Operating Agreement are modified to clarify that PJM Technologies, Inc. shall not qualify as a participant in PJM's load response pilot program unless PJM makes a filing explaining why PJM Technologies, Inc. should be permitted to participate. See May 30 Order, slip op. at 12.
- Original Sheet Nos. 256J and 265O of the PJM Tariff and Original Sheet Nos. 119J and 119O of the PJM Operating Agreement are modified to specify that, on or before December 28, 2001, PJM will file an informational report with the Commission. The report shall evaluate the effectiveness of the load response program. As directed by the May 30 Order, among other things, the report shall contain comparisons of: (1) the amount of demand-side reduction obtained by the PJM members' demand-side management programs during the year prior to the initiation of PJM's load response program and the amount of demand-side reduction since the initiation of the program, and (2) the total amount of demand-side reduction prior to, and since the initiation, of the load response program. Id. slip op. at 9-10.

In addition to these modifications, PJM reiterates its commitment to work together with PJM members to ensure that its load response program does not interfere with existing demand-side programs. Id. slip op. at 9.

#### **Effective Date**

Consistent with the May 30 Order, PJM requests an effective date of June 1, 2001 for the modified PJM Tariff and PJM Operating Agreement sheets. See id. slip op. at 13.
