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NOTICE OF PROCEDURAL SCHEDULE

To: Parties of Record and Interested Persons

On February 9, 2011, the Office of People’s Counsel filed with the Public Service Commission (“Commission”) a *Petition for Clarification and an Order Directing the Investor-Owned Utilities to Correct Erroneous Information on Bills and Web Sites and Request for Expedited Review* (“Petition”).¹ In the Petition, OPC alleges that the Standard Offer Service (“SOS”) pricing information found on customer’s bills from the investor-owned utilities (“IOUs”) and the IOUs’ websites contain inaccurate and outdated information, including a failure by certain IOUs to remove the term “Price to Compare” from their websites as previously directed by the Commission. Further, OPC asks that the Commission immediately direct the IOUs to provide accurate information on their bills and updated and accurate information on their websites using language compliant with the Commission’s Order No. 82423. Additionally, OPC proposes a process by which IOUs would be required to update their web postings and bills after a SOS procurement solicitation occurs. Finally, OPC requests that the Commission set the matter for hearing as soon as possible.

The Commission hereby sets the following procedural schedule for the purpose of considering the Petition:

- By March 7, 2011, each IOU shall respond to the allegations made by OPC in the Petition, and all parties shall file any comments on OPC’s allegations and proposed process;
- By March 21, 2011, parties shall file any reply comments; and

- A hearing shall be conducted on Tuesday, March 29, 2011, to beginning at 10 a.m. in the Commission's 16th Floor Hearing Room, William Donald Schaefer Tower, 6 St. Paul Street, Baltimore, Maryland.
